Dear Neighbor:

This is a message of real importance to you from your new Fire Company. It concerns the lives and property in this community.

The rapid residential growth, and the ever-increasing investment in farm and business property in our community presents a problem that must be faced. It places a tremendous burden on the surrounding fire companies. We are confronted with the duty of relieving the strain upon those who have served us so faithfully for years. The future demands that we carry our share of the responsibility by protecting ourselves.

The citizens of this community have accepted the challenge by public expression at the Franklin Township School Meeting that a fire company be formed immediately. This has been done by reviving a dormant organization in the community known as the Quakertown Fire Company.

122 men have already pledged their services as firemen; 46 women have formed the Ladies Auxiliary to support the company. These people have pledged a service that money can't buy. The money you give will help to buy the equipment needed to serve you.

The decision must be made right now! Earnest men have canvassed the situation....details have been studied....a volunteer fire company is an absolute need in the Quakertown-Pittstown-Cherryville and bordering areas. The money asked is modest.

\$12,000 is needed at once for land, building and equipment. The campaign to raise this is now under way. Receipt of this letter indicates that you are located in the territory to be served. A card index of your property has already been set up.

Shortly, solicitors will call to receive your donation and to complete your card with information needed to serve you best in case of fire.

This undertaking is for the benefit of all, and all must help to make it a success. Your generous contribution will be appreciated.
